


TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS FOR THE EU EMBLEM AND MALTESE FLAG

Use of the EU Emblem


Recipients of EU funding have the obligation to ensure that the EU emblem can easily be seen in a given context. This context might vary and depends on many factors, and due attention needs to be given, for example, to the emblem's size, positioning, colour and quality relative to its context. Also, users must ensure the correct version of the logos, EU Emblem and national Flag is used in accordance with the medium to be utilised.

It is important that EU Emblem and the Maltese Flag are always used in the same format (e.g. full colour or monochrome). The use of logos in full colour on a white background is highly recommended, but a monochrome version may also be used in justified cases. The term monochrome refers to the black-and-white (greyscale) version of the emblem and the flag. Monochrome versions are to be utilised on black and white printing (in grey shades) or where only one colour is available (in this case black). These versions are to be reproduced on a white background only.


The minimum height of the Maltese flag and the EU emblem must be 1 cm. For specific items, like pens, the emblem can be reproduced in a smaller size. The Maltese flag should be placed on the left hand side, with an adequate "protection area" between the two logos, as reproduced below:









Use of the EU Funds for Malta logo

As was the case for the 2014-2020 Programming period, the EU emblem and the National Flag of Malta should be displayed together with the Parliamentary Secretariat logo and the EU funds logo.

The Parliamentary Secretariat logo should always appear on the top left-hand side, the EU Funds logo at the top right-hand corner and the third-party logo in the middle. If the third-party logo does not fit between these two logos, it should be positioned at the bottom left, unless the design requires otherwise, and following authorisation by the Managing Authority.

The EU Funds logo, the Parliamentary Secretariat logo, the EU Emblem and the Maltese flag must never be rendered smaller than other logos placed in the same field of vision. **The minimum height of all logos and flags should preferable be 2cm, however, in specific cases where space is restricted, all logos and flags can be scaled down to not less than 1.5cm.**
